Purpose

To provide clear guidelines regarding requests relating to unmade, unformed and formed roads.

The policy will assist Council in determining the extent to which it will be involved in the survey and capital improvement and/or maintenance of unmade or unformed road reserves.

To ensure any works on unmade, unformed, or formed roads are undertaken without impact on existing budgeted works.

To ensure that there is a fair and transparent process in place for the improvement of unmade roads.

Note: This policy does not apply to vehicular access (driveway) from the road to the property boundary as per Councils Crossings (driveways) Policy.

Definitions

Public Road Reserve: An area of land gazetted to public use as a road, but does not include State controlled roads. In some cases, these areas may be graded periodically as fire access tracks, or for other purposes. For the purposes of this policy, these roads are considered unmade.

Sealed road: A road with bitumen or asphalt surface.

Sheeted road: A formed and surfaced road with pavements constructed of gravel or rubble and by the use of stabilisation processes.

Formed road: A public road reserve that does not have gravel paving but which is formed using a grader so that stormwater drainage will occur.

Unformed road: A public road reserve that has been cleared and open to, and routinely used by the public.

Unmade road: A public road reserve that has had no capital improvements including clearing. Notwithstanding, an unmade road may be trafficable or un-trafficable in all weathers.

Policy

There is no obligation on the Council to undertake capital improvement and/or maintenance of unmade, unformed, or formed roads within a public road reserve for the purpose of access by the land owner to his or her property.

In general, Council will not undertake capital improvements or maintenance works to unmade, unformed, or formed roads where the road does not provide access to a property with an existing dwelling. Special circumstances, where a benefit to the community can be demonstrated, such as firefighting access, weed control and access to camp grounds and tourist attractions, may be considered at Councils discretion.

Should a landowner require access via an unmade or unformed road Council expects that the landowner will provide that access at their cost. This puts them in the same situation as a developer who has to upgrade roads at their cost as part of a new development.

Where a public road reserve is constructed to a standard approved by Council, and inspected and accepted by the Works Coordinator, Council will continue to maintain the road to a standard set by resource and budgetary constraints applicable within each financial year in accordance with Council's Infrastructure Asset Management Plan.

Delegations

The Manager for Infrastructure Services must be consulted on the establishment of any road on an unmade road reserve. The decision to allow the capital improvements of an unmade road reserve must be resolved by a Council resolution.

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
